23 Sinadinoski mentioned that the new Planning Assistant, Tracey Crocker, began working with the
24 Planning & Economic Development team on Monday, April 23rd. Sinadinoski said that Green-Up Day
25 will be on Saturday, May 5th and there are trash bags available in the Planning & Economic
26 Development office. Sinadinoski uploaded a housing Microsoft Excel spreadsheet on the planning
27 website that shows houses and apartments for sale or rent within the Town of Milton. Sinadinoski also
