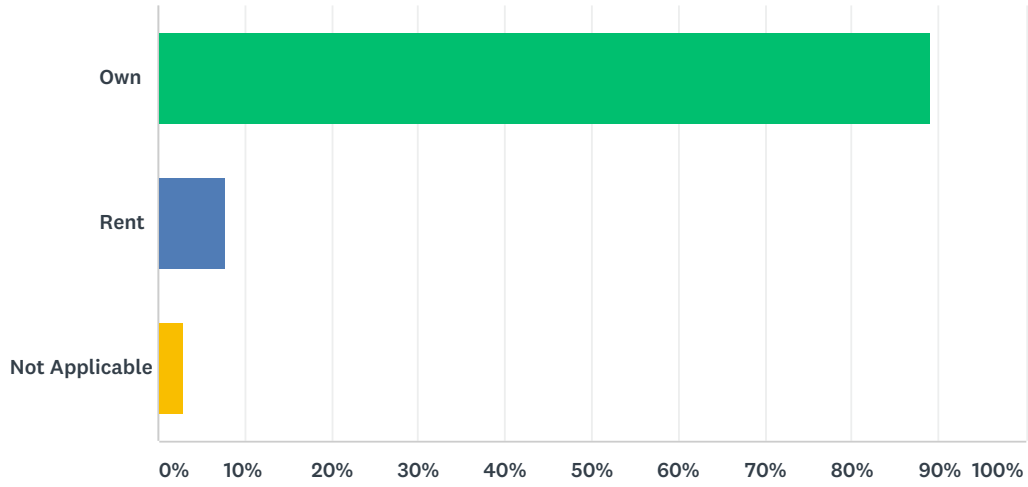


Q1 Do you own or rent your home?

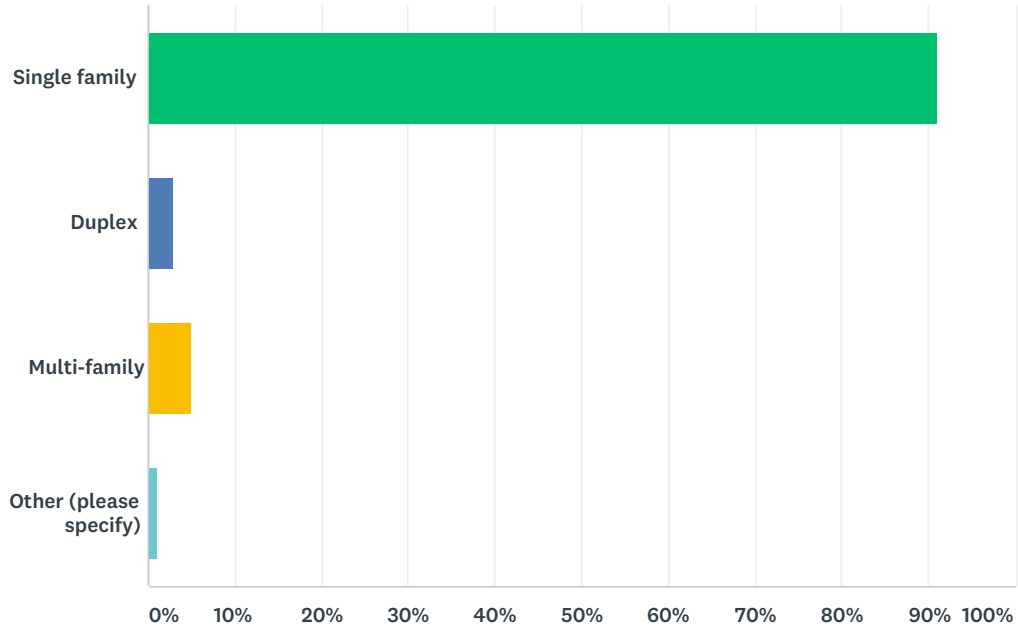

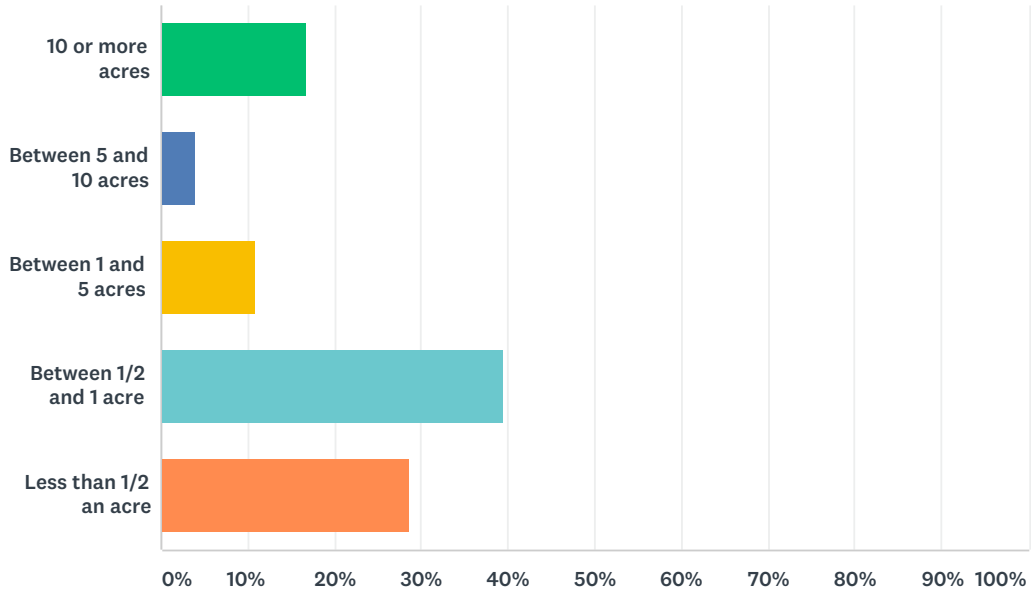

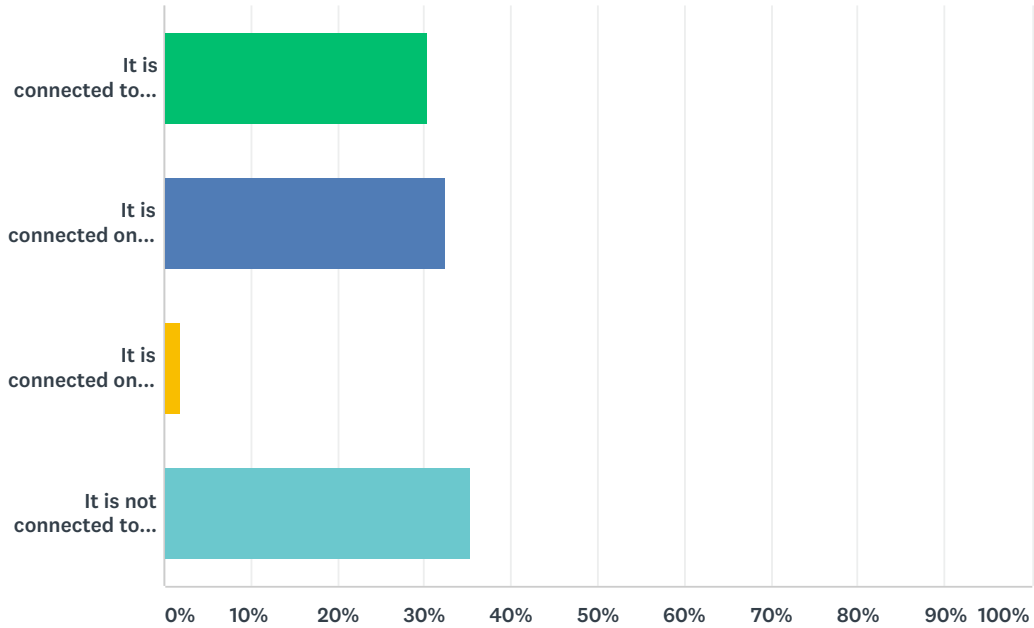

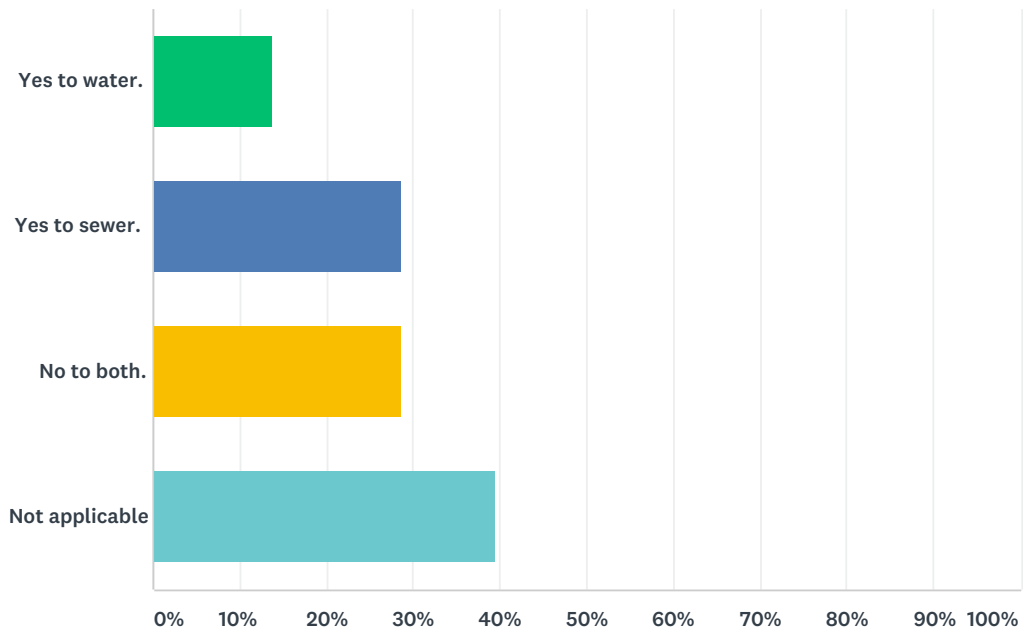

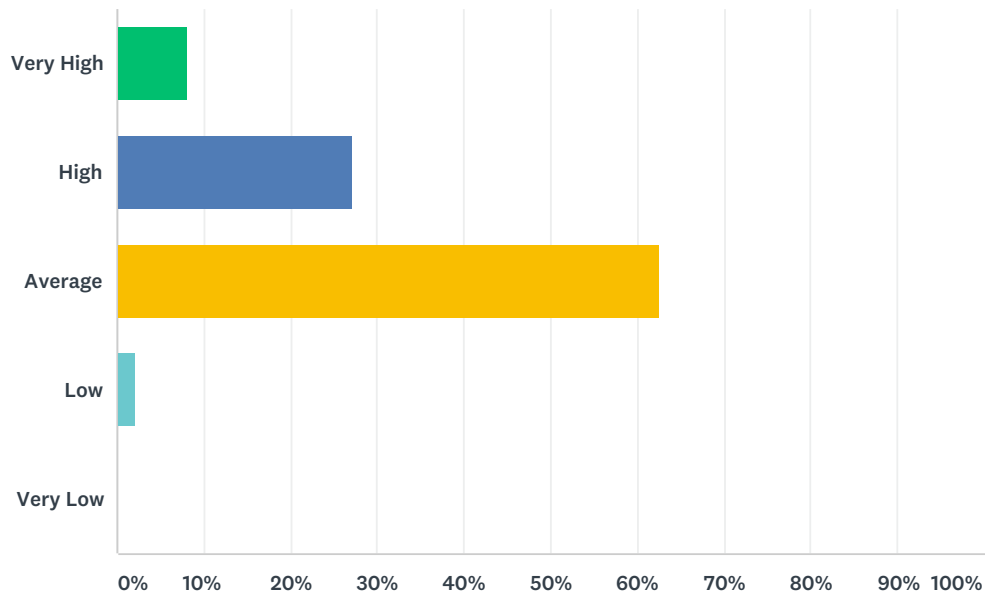

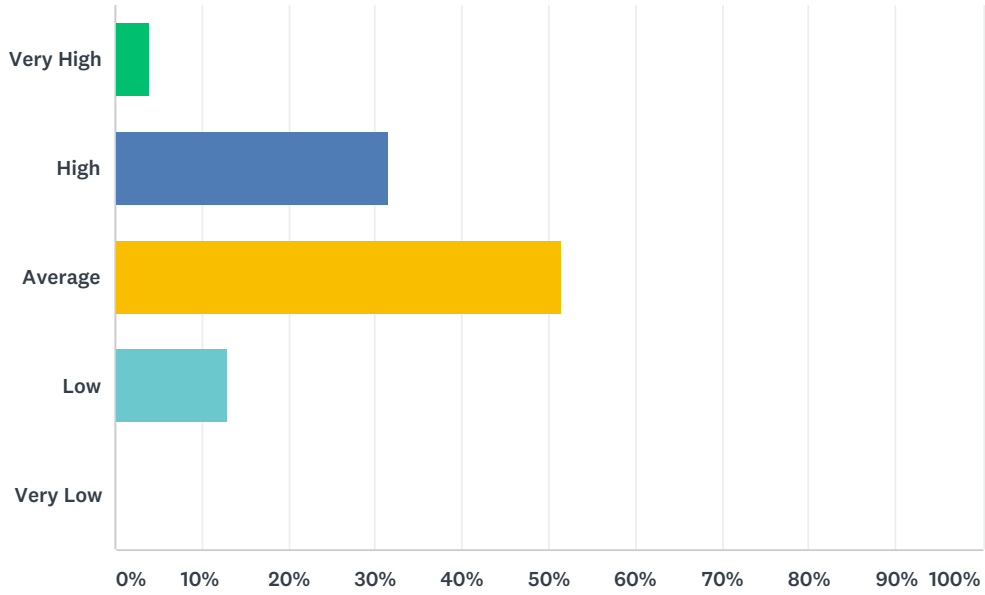

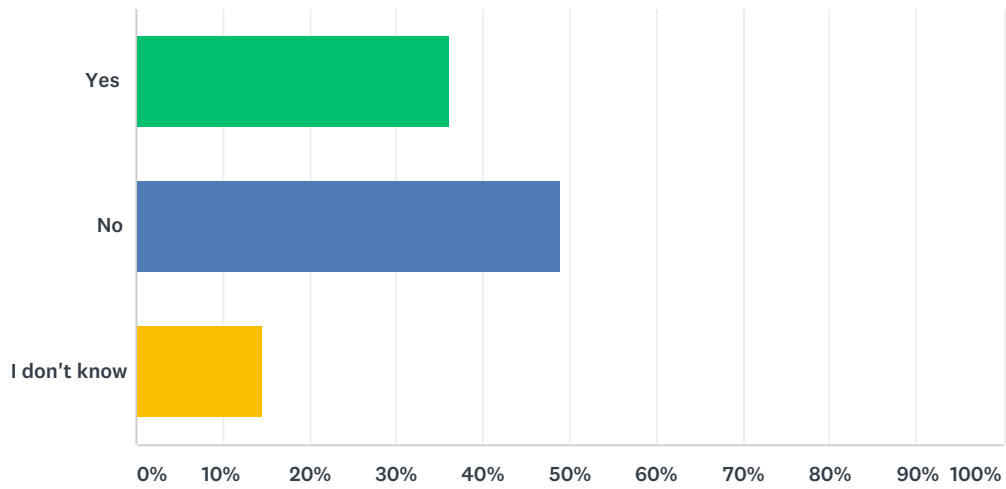

Q8 In general, do you believe there is enough affordable housing in Milton?

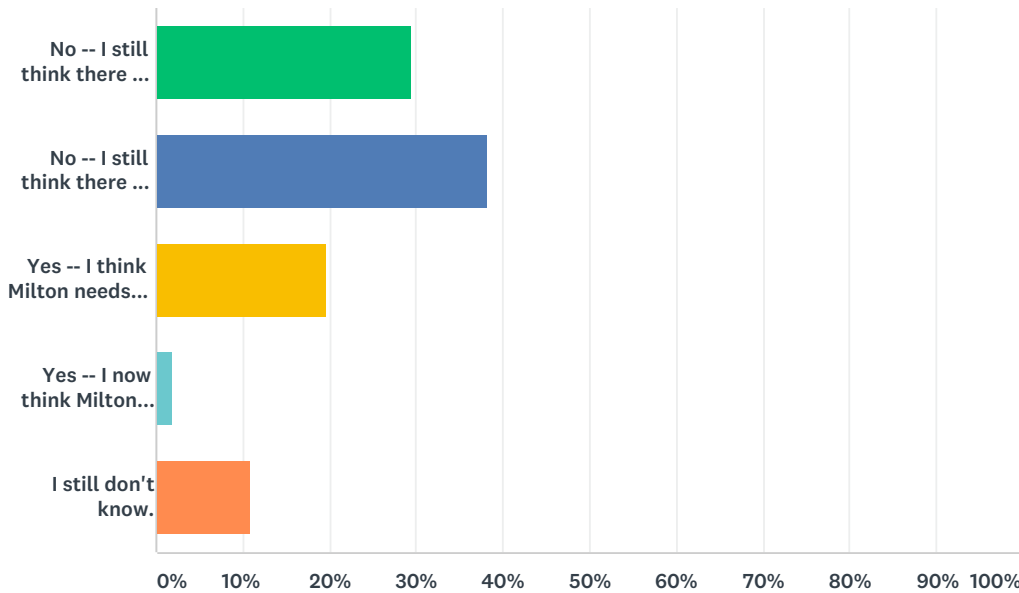

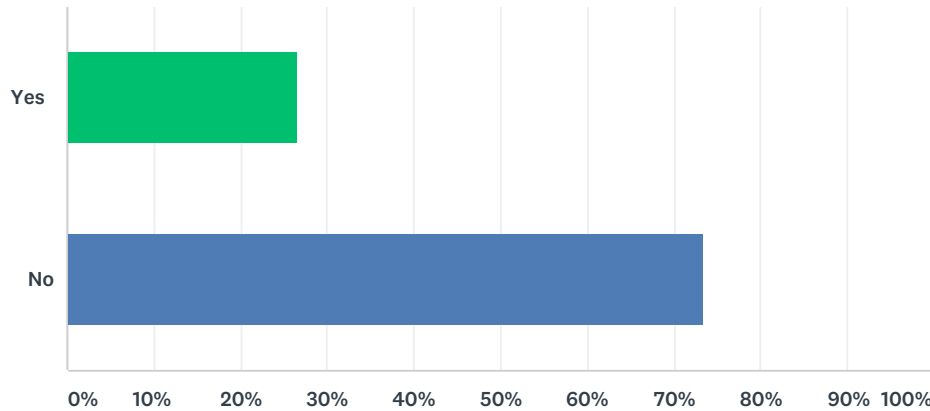

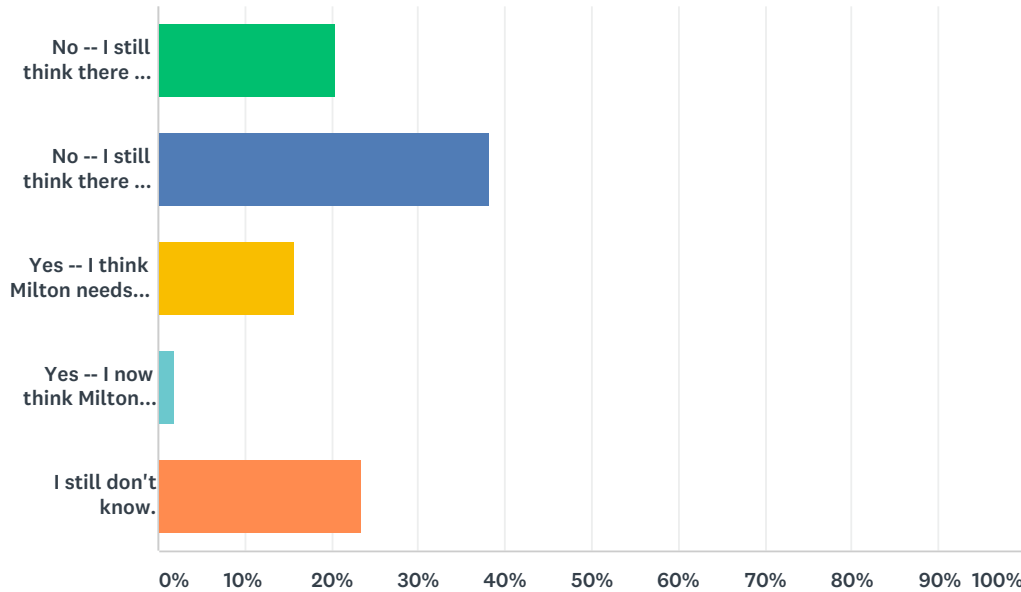

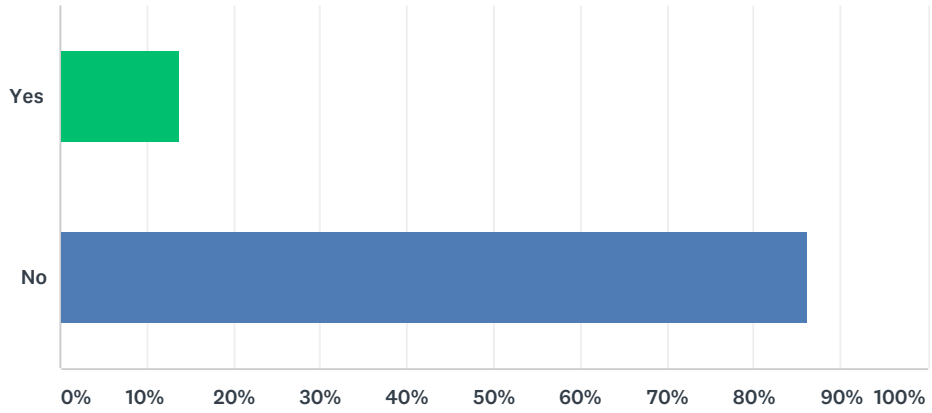

Q13 Are you currently seeking to move to another home in Milton?

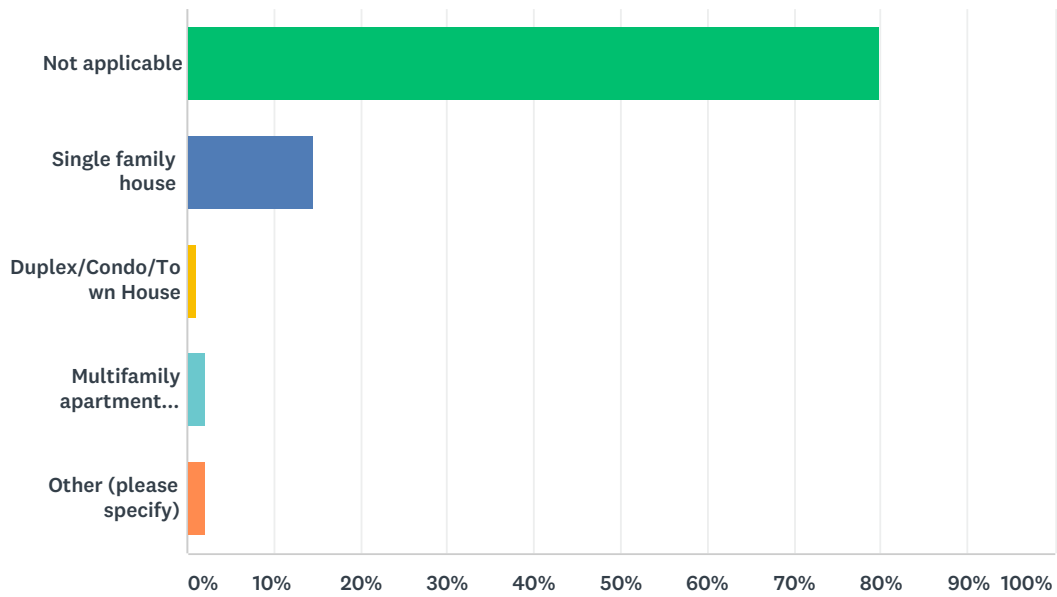

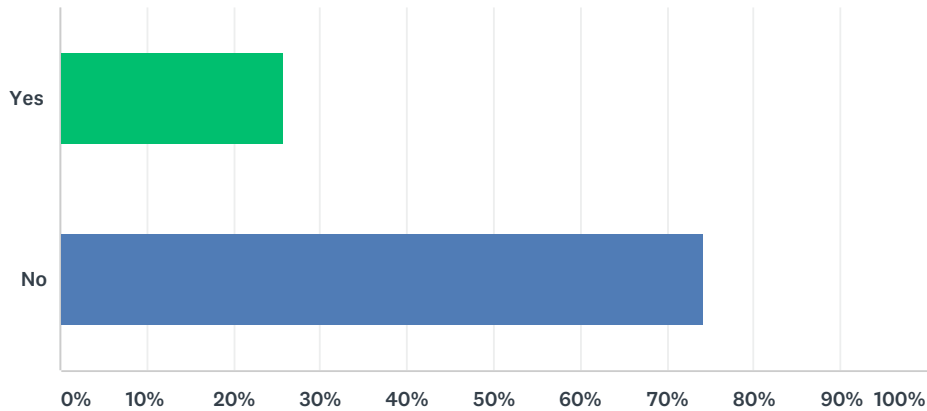

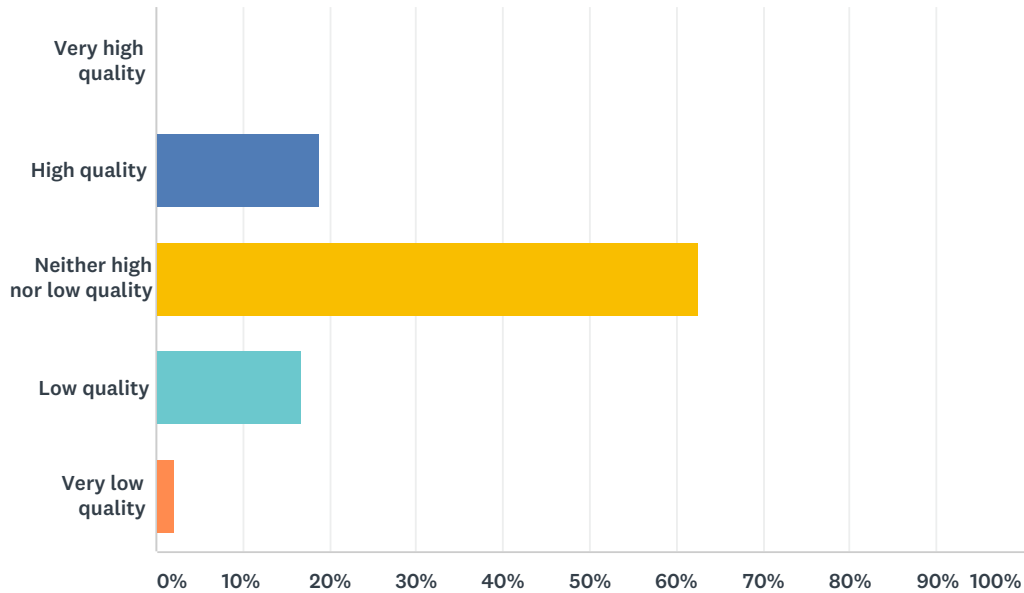
